* Historians have divided the study of History into three stages.

* Medieval period is the stage between Ancient and Modern.

* Medieval period in India (8 to 18 century) is regarded as the beginning of a number of changes taking place in the Polity, Economy etc.

* Medieval period in Europe (6 to 16 century) is regarded as a dynamic one owing to its massive developments.

* Roman's conquered Palestine, which was the homeland of the jews in the 1st century BCE

* King Herod tortured and killed many Jews. In return, the jews revolted but were crushed over and over again. This led to a cry for a messiah, who would liberate them from foreign rule.

* The Christian calendar mark's the birth of Jeaus Christ at 4 century BC (Before Christ) and the later years as AD (Anno Domini), which means in the year of the Lord.

* Jesus was born in a small village of Bethlehem which is in Palestine.

* The central idea of Jesus's teachings were, God is the loving father of all, therefore all men are brothers and sisters.

* Christianity is the Monotheistic religion, which emphasizes the belief in one God.

* On 30 CE, Jesus Christ was crucified in Golgotha, by the Roman governor, Pontius Pilate

* The cross henceforth became the sacred symbol for all Christian's.

* It was the magical resurrection of Christ, who rose from the dead and ascended in Heaven, which restored Courage among His followers.

* His faithful twelve apostles, helped in spreading His message of Love and Brotherhood.

* This is how Christianity began to spread rapidly throughout the world.
